9/11 and COVID-19 – What We Didn't Learn

Presentation by: Antonio Dajer, MD, FACEP

Join Dr. Dajer as he describes his experience as the sole attending emergency physician on duty the morning of 9/11 and being uniquely positioned to take part in the largest single-hospital disaster response in American history. New York Downtown Hospital is located just 5 city blocks from where the Twin Towers stood. He will give perspective on the parallels with the current COVID-19 pandemic response and what we did not learn from the 9/11 disaster. In 2008, the American College of Emergency Physicians named Dr. Dajer a "Hero of Emergency Medicine" for his role on 9/11.
